



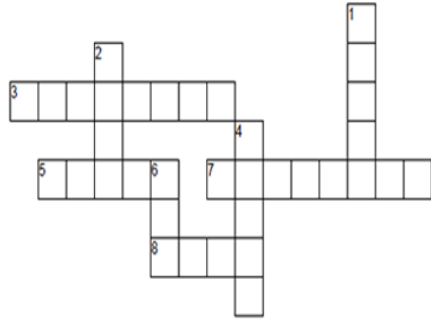

In today's gospel, Jesus presents himself as the gate of the sheepfold, the one through whom true life and safety come. He contrasts himself with thieves and robbers who climb in from the side, symbolizing all false paths, manipulative voices, and ideologies that promise life but lead only to loss and confusion. By saying, "I am the gate," Jesus claims that the only way to fullness of life, peace of conscience, and communion with God is through him, through his word, his cross, and his sacraments.

This image also invites us to examine how we are entering into faith. Do we come to Christ through the gate of humility, prayer, and obedience, or do we try to "climb over elsewhere" by relying on our own achievements, status, or half-hearted compromises with sin? The true sheep are those who recognize his voice in the Gospel, in the Church, and in the quiet promptings of conscience, and who follow him, even when the path leads through the cross. In that trust, Jesus promises that we "will be saved and will come in and go out and find pasture," a life of freedom, sustenance, and security.

Finally, Jesus' self-presentation as the gate is deeply Good-Shepherd news for the Church in our time. In a world where many feel lost, anxious, or spiritually homeless, he reminds us that he is the one place of refuge and belonging. As we gather around the Eucharist, we are not just commemorating a distant teacher but passing through the living gate of Christ to enter the one fold of his mercy. May we, who have passed through this gate, also help others to hear his voice and to find the green pastures of grace and peace that he alone can give.

Catechesis Corner

Synod on Synodality

The Catholic teaching on the Synod on Synodality presents synodality as an objective dimension of the Church's nature, rooted in baptism and the action of the Holy Spirit, through which the whole People of God walks together in communion, participation, and mission. It is not simply a new "event" or "reform," but a way of being Church that reflects the ecclesial vision of the Second Vatican Council, especially the image of the Church as the pilgrim and missionary People of God journeying toward the Kingdom.

Official explanations emphasize that synodality means discerning together—laity, priests, religious, and bishops—under the guidance of the Holy Spirit, listening to one another, to Scripture, and to the signs of the times. This process of "walking together" is meant to deepen co-responsibility in the Church's mission, while always respecting the hierarchical and collegial authority of bishops and the supreme teaching, sanctifying, and governing office of the Bishop of Rome, whose role as principle and center of unity remains unchanged.

The Synod on Synodality's texts and final documents, when approved and ratified by the Pope, are understood to form part of the ordinary Magisterium, clarifying and applying existing doctrine to the life and structures of the Church today. The teaching therefore calls all Catholics to greater active participation in their local communities, to spiritual discernment in dialogue, and to renewed openness to the Spirit, so that the Church can more faithfully and joyfully proclaim the Gospel to the world.

Welcome

On this Fourth Sunday of Easter "Good Shepherd Sunday", we gather in the light of the Risen Lord, we give thanks that the Spirit still calls people into the Church, just as on Pentecost, and that the Lord continues to shepherd us through the trials of life by his word and sacraments.

The First Reading from Acts 2:14,36-41, Peter stands before the crowd and boldly proclaims that Jesus, whom they crucified, is now raised and exalted by God as Lord and Christ.

The Second Reading from 1 Peter 2:20-25, As members of Christ flock, we are called to walk in his footsteps, bearing our crosses with hope, knowing that the Shepherd carries us when we are too weak to walk on our own.

The Gospel According to John 10:1-10, Jesus declares, "I am the gate for the sheep," and promises that whoever enters through him "will be saved and will come in and go out and find pasture."
